1.0.ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Teachers Training College (TTC), B.Ed. Aalo, located in the picturesque town of Aalo under West Siang District; Arunachal Pradesh was established in the year 2011, with the mission of enhancing the quality of education and equipping students with the right knowledge, skill and values. The college holds permanent affiliation with Rajiv Gandhi University, Rono Hills, Itanagar, (A central University) and it follows semester system while introducing the choice based credit system (CBCS). The college has been running under the aegis of Marjum welfare society, dedicated to fostering educational excellence as well as community development.

While it initially offered a B.Ed programme coured as teaching education and holistic development, the college is now expanding its academic horizon. In line with the National Education Policy (NEP)-2020 and the growing demand for multidisciplinary education, the college has been granted approval to introduced Bachelor of Arts (B.A), Bachelor of Science (B.Sc) programs from the academic session 2025-26, with due affiliation from Rajiv Gandhi University.

With a strong commitment to providing quality higher education at the doorstep of students in this remote region, the college aims to empower youth by offering a broad-based inclusive and value oriented learning environment. The introduction of B.A and B.Sc programme will diversity academic opportunity and profession growth of students.

To support holistic development, the college also has an active unit of the National Service Scheme (NSS), which engage students in various community service and activities, fostering a sense of social responsibility and Nation-building.

The college already has well-equip library and Laboratory facilities, which will support the newly introduced programs. Additionally, recruitment of qualified faculty and staff has been done to ensure effective academic delivery.

1.3 COLLEGE DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE:

In order to maintain discipline and a peaceful atmosphere in the college, the college has a dedicated disciplinary committee. This committee comprises of three professors and one member each from B.A, B.Sc & B.Ed senior students. The college Development Committee suggests ways and means for evolving/developing congenial environment within the college. 1.4 PLASTIC & TOBACCO FREE ZONE:

1.5 SCHOLARSHIP/ STIPEND:

Candidates having 75% or more attendance are awarded with book grant and stipend from the Director of Higher and Technical Education, Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh, Itanagar. After being admitted to the college, they must submit the filled up forms to the Directorate through the Principal /HoD.

1.6 ATTENDANCE:

A student must attend 75% of the theory classes as well as of the co-curricular programmes to become eligible for appearing in the semester examinations. Students who fail to attend their classes over a certain period of time, only on reasonable and acceptance grounds (Such as serious diseases, accidents or treatments or death of near and dear ones etc.) must apply to the principal for consideration or exemption of the absences for the period immediately.

1.8 LIBRARY:

The library is well equipped with modern computer facility and E- Library facility to support students in their academic endeavours along with good number of text books and references as well; reference room provides enough space in a comfortable environment for the library during the college hour.

1.9 COMPUTER LAB:

3.0. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA :

For B.A 1st semester: Must have passed the AISSCE (10+2) or any other equivalent examination with a minimum of 40% aggregate in five papers with pass in English (core) as a compulsory subject. Students opting for an elective subject must have passed in the particular subject at class xii level, except in the case of education and sociology. Additionally, they must qualify RGUCET/CUET/ENTRANCE TEST

For B.Sc. 1st Semester: Passed in the corresponding subject at (10+2) stage with marks not less than 45% in aggregate with pass in English (core) & chemistry. Student opting for CBZ must secure pass marks in biology at 10+2 level. Additionally, they must qualify RGUCET/CUET/ENTRANCE TEST

For B.Ed. 1st Semester: Eligible for admission to B.Ed course of duration two year (four semester) shall be as per NCTE norms, i.e. candidate must bachelor /master degree in arts/science/commerce, securing 50% marks or above from a UGC recognised university. Additionally, they must qualify RGUCET/CUET/ENTRANCE TEST

(Relaxation of marks for reserved category will be govt. rule i.e. 45% (ST, SC and OBC)

4.1. ADMISSION FEE

4.2. COURSES OFFERED

1.1. INFORMATION ON DISCIPLINES OFFERED: (BA, B.Sc And B.Ed.)

Bachelor of Arts (BA): Education, Political science and History

Bachelor of Science (B.Sc): Botany, Zoology, and Chemistry,

B.Ed: Subjects offered under the 2 year B.Ed. programme focus on perspectives in education and include pedagogy papers from the school curriculum. These subjects are selected from 2nd Semester onwards and include practicum and internship components.

4.3 ADMISSION PROCEDURE:

College adheres to the guidelines set forth by the state govt. For the admission process, ensuring compliance with the reservation policy and catchment area norms the details admission procedure is as follows:


1. **Eligibility Criteria:** candidates must meet the eligibility criteria mentioned at point 3.0
2. **Entrance Test:** Admission to various programs will be primarily based on the scores obtained in the common university entrance test (CUET).
However, our college also conducts its own entrance test to fill any remaining seats in accordance with the state governments' reservation policy and catchment area norms.
3. **Reservation Policy:** The reservation policy of the state government will be strictly followed. Specific quotas for different categories (SC/ST/OBC/EWS/PWD) will be maintained as per government regulations.
4. **Catchment area norms:** Preference will be given to candidates from local catchment area as defined by the state government guidelines.
5. **Application Processes:** Interested candidates must register on the CUET portal/ Samarth portal and submit their application online.
For the college; own entrance test, candidate must fill out and additional application form available from the college office
6. **Selection Processes:** Candidates will be shortlisted based on their performance in CUET/ RGUCET and the college's entrance list. Final selection will consider both entrance tests scores and Adherence to reservation policies.
7. **Documents Verification and admission.** Shortlisted candidates must attend the document verification process on specified dates.

Admission will be confirmed only after the verification of all required documents and payment of the admission fee.

8. **Important dates:** Detailed schedule of the entrance test, applications deadlines and documents verification will be provided on the college prospectus and college office.

Aspiring students can collect the prescribed application forms and prospectus from the college office counter and submit the duly filled in application form along with attested copies of documents before the last date of admission. Admission of a student will be preceded by parents or guardians interfacing after the oral interview and shall be subject to RGU/NEP/CUET/SAMARTH guidelines. Failing to personal appearance of student / parent for interview and verifications of documents thereof will forfeit admission. Admission is granted strictly on the merit basis and subject to availability of seats.

NEP-2020 has been introduced from the session 2023-24, (BA and B.Sc- NEW ADMISSION) and a brief representation of the course structure is given below:

5.0. SUBMISSION OF ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS:

The students who takes admission are required to submit their original certificates and mark sheets of all examinations passed till date (i.e, class x onwards). Submission of pass certificate and migration certificate for registration of migrated students other than CBSE Board are necessary since admission is subject to verification within stipulated time by RGU and failing to do so will result in cancellation of admission.

2. Fees once paid will not be refunded under any circumstances. It is not also adjustable against any other fees of the college.
3. Student who discontinued the course during half of the session shall not be refunded his/her fees under any circumstances.

6.0. UNIVERSITY RULES AND GUIDELINES:

1. Migration certificate is not required if a student has passed AISSCE (CBSE New Delhi) from the school located in Arunachal Pradesh. Candidates from other parts of India/Boards/University are required to submit Migration at the time of Admission.
2. Student in order to be eligible for filling up the University Examination form shall be required to attend not less than 75% of the full course of lecture delivered in each of the subject/papers in theory and practical (if any) separately.
3. The students appearing in the compartmental Examination are to fill up separate forms for regular and compartmental Examinations separately.
4. Candidates having appeared and failed three times in Honours/pass course with practical subject are allowed to get re-admission in the first semester. Students who are debarred from filling up the University Examination form by college Authorities or who could not fill up the form have to take re-admission in the new session.

5. Students can apply for Improvement Examination after having completed the three year Degree course. After the declaration of the final year examination result and within one year from the date of declaration of result.
6. Students may apply for Re-scrutiny of his/her answer scripts within 30 days from the date of declaration of the results of degree examination in a prescribed form along with a fee of ₹ 100/- for each paper (Max.2 paper). Re-scrutiny form is available in the Academic Branch.
7. The three year Degree course must be completed within a maximum period of Six years.

6.1.B.A, B.SC and B.ED (Semester) Examination & Evaluation

- a) Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis
- b) There shall be 20% marks for Internal Assessment and 80% marks for end semester examination in each course during semester.
- c) There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answer scripts of the end semester examination However, a candidate may apply for Re-scrutiny.

6.2. INTERNAL ASSESSMENT:

In internal assessment, different tools may be employed such as written test, Assignment, paper presentation, laboratory work etc. suitable to the courses the procedure for internal Assessment shall be as prescribed by the concerned board. There shall be three internal Assessments for each paper and average best of two shall be taken into account for university examination. A student has a clear 02(two) sessional test of each respectively to be qualified for taking end semester examination

The students shall be informed in advance about the nature of assessment. Students shall compulsorily attend and clear the internal assessment, failing which will not be allowed to appear in the end semester examination.

6.3. END SEMESTER EXAMINATION :

There shall be one End semester examination carrying 80% marks in each course of a semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the course. The end semester examination is normally a written/ laboratory based examination/ project work/ Dissertation as the case maybe.

The controller of examination shall then take necessary arrangement for notifying the dates of the end semester examination and other procedures as per Rajiv Gandhi University rules and the Academic calendar notified by the university. The end semester examination for each course shall be of three hours duration.

6.4. IMPROVEMENT EXAMINATION:

- ✓ A student shall be allowed to take the improvement examinations in any four theory courses of any of the six semesters after passing the sixth semester examination only once. In this case, the higher marks secured by the student shall be retained. The candidate shall have to apply for improvement examination within one year of passing the semester examination.
- ✓ No improvement shall be allowed in the practical examinations.
- ✓ Any difficulty which may arise in the course of operation of these guidelines/regulations relating to holding of examinations shall be removed by the examination committee of Rajiv Gandhi University.

6.5 RESULTS AND PROGRESSION:

- A candidate shall be declared as passed course provided he/she secures-
- At least 35% marks in the course and 40% in aggregate in the end semester examinations.
- At least 40% marks in the sessional /Internal examination (In- Semester) and End semester examinations separately.
- A candidate shall be declared as passed a semester, provided he/she passes all be courses of a semester independently both in internal and End semester examinations.

- The marks of In-semester examinations /sessional test obtained by the candidate shall be carried over for declaring a result.
- A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more courses of any End semester examination shall be provisionally promoted to the next higher semester with the failed course as carried over course(s). Such candidates will be eligible to appear in the carried over course in the next regular examinations of those courses. However, the following restrictions shall be applicable.
 - a) In order to move from a lower to higher semester, a candidate must pass in at least two theory courses and all the practical courses with an aggregate of 40% marks.
 - b) A candidate shall be entitled to a maximum of three consecutive chances to clear a back paper course.
 - c) A candidate shall be allowed to get maximum two back papers in each semester.
 - d) If a candidate clears the sixth semester examination before clearing all the backlog courses of the previous semesters, the final result of the candidate shall be kept withheld until he/she clears the backlog courses of the previous semesters.
 - e) A student must pass all his/her semester examinations within six years i.e within 12 continuous semesters. In no circumstance this requirement shall be relaxed.
 - f) Since the semester system involves continuous assessment, there shall be no scope for a student appears as a private candidate in any programme in this system.
 - g) A candidate shall be declared to have passed the six semester's degree B.A programme provided he/she has passed all the semesters and in all the courses separately securing an aggregate of at least 40% marks.
 - h) The degrees shall be conferred to candidates, who pass the six semester degree B.A programme in the following manner.

7.0 THE NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY (NEP 2020):

From the academic session 2024-25, Rajiv Gandhi University is introducing 4 years UG programme under the new education policy 2020, which is mandated by the govt. of India. The new system offers many new provisions to students, like multiple entry and exit in academic programmes throughout the course of Under-graduation, RGUCET and common university entrance test (CUET), internship/apprenticeship embedded degree programme, academic bank of credits with curriculum and credit framework for undergraduate programme, etc.

9.0 PROVISION OF RAGGING

As per government order number ED/HE-301/2008/120 Dtd. 22/04/2009 and directives of the Honourable Supreme Court, any behaviour or act that may come under the definition of ragging will be viewed with extreme gravity and will invite exemplary punishment as Deemed fit by the authority.

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence, as established by the anti-ragging committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be anyone or any combination of the following:

1. Cancellation of admission.
2. Suspension from attending classes.
3. Withholding/ withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
4. Debarring from appearing in any test /examination or other evolution process.
5. Withholding results.
6. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or International meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
7. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
8. Rustication from the institution for a period ranging from 1 to 4th semester.
9. Expulsion from the Institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other Institution.
10. Fine of Rupees 25000/-
11. Collective punishment: when the person committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall Resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential ragging

10.0 CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE STUDENTS:

Students are required to wear uniforms on all working days. However, on the 15th of each month, they can participate in “Vocal for Local” by wearing indigenous dress.
